





















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


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


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





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## TRANSPORTATION TRENDS

### National, State, Local



- National Trends Pre-Covid:
  - Declining transit ridership in many cities
  - Some growth in car travel (vehicle miles traveled)
  - Little change in fatalities
  - Some growth in bike/pedestrian trips
  - Continuing growth in freight trips/tonnage
  - Declining bridge and pavement conditions
- National Trends Since Covid:
  - Initial sharp declines in all modes of travel
  - Slow recovery of transit ridership
  - Increase of bike/pedestrian travel in many places
  - Return to pre-Covid levels of auto travel
  - Large increase in freight trips/tonnage
  - Change in type and timing of trips
  - Increase in crashes, fatalities

## INFRASTRUCTURE FUNDING

### Federal and State Bills



- Illinois Capital Bill AND US Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA)
- IIJA:
  - \$863.7B over 5 years; \$590.7B for transportation
  - Nearly 400 different pots of formula and discretionary ("competitive grant") funds
  - Similar to prior bills in many ways, but some shift in focus to equity, environment, technology
  - Large passenger rail investment
  - Large investment in alternative fuels, electric vehicle infrastructure, and R&D
