 Ty Livingston moved to approve minutes of February 15, 2023 meeting and Jeff Gilles seconded.

- 5. Recommend to Commission Transportation Improvement Program Amendments Attachment
 - a. Project CL-24-04 Diesel Buses
 - b. Project CL-24-08 Refurbish 35' Diesel Buses
 - c. Project CL-24-09 New Farebox/Validators System
 - d. Project CL-24-10 A & E Services

Patrick Meyer moved to recommend to Commission Transportation Improvement Program Amendments a thru d and Josie Esker seconded.

- Michael Bruner updated on
 - o a. Project CL-24-04 Diesel Buses
 - Adding additional funding
 - FTA 5307 funding- Total of \$6 million with \$5,200,000 of additional funds, and Transit Transportation Development Credit (TDC) funding- \$1.5 million
 - GPMTD has 20 buses that have reached their useful life
 - Looking to replace 9 to 10 of the 20 buses with this funding.
 - b. Project CL-24-08 Refurbish 35' Diesel Buses
 - Adding to the FY 2024 Program
 - Looking to refurbish the remaining 10 buses that have reached their useful life with \$2.7 million
 - o c. Project CL-24-09 New Farebox/Validators System
 - Adding to the FY2024 Program
 - This project is upgrading CityLink, CityLift, and CountyLink buses with new validator systems that allow riders to use multiple methods for paying fares.
 - o d. Project CL-24-10 A & E Services
 - Adding to FY2024 Program
 - The funding is for extending the construction oversight and administration due to delays with new maintenance and administrative facilities.

Motion carried.

- 6. Recommend to Commission Transit Asset Management Performance Measure Attachment Jeff Gilles moved to recommend to Commission Transit/Asset Management Performance Measure and Patrick Meyer seconded.
 - Michael Bruner updated on:
 - The National Transit Asset Management System requires all agencies that receive federal financial assistance that own, operate, or manage capitol assets used in provision of public transportation to create a Transit Asset Management (TAM) Plan.
 - Agencies can meet this requirement either through an Individual or Group TAM Plan.
 - IDOT, the Illinois Public Transit Association (IPTA), and the Rural Transit Assistance Center (RTAC) cooperatively supported the development of the Illinois' Group TAM Plan for all Tier 2 agencies.
 - Tier 2 provider means a recipient that owns, operates, or manages 100 or fewer vehicles in revenue service (rolling stock) during peak regular service across all non-rail fixed route modes or in any one non-fixed route mode, a sub-recipient under the 5311 Rural Area Formula Program, or any American Indian tribe.
 - Historically, TCRPC has elected to support the TIER 2 Group Plan Transit Asset Management Performance Measures and other state's targets. MPO's are not assessed for significant progress made towards established targets.
 - We are electing to support the Tier 2 Group TAM Plan targets.
 - You can find the baseline data as well as projected data on page 2 & 3 of the memo.

7. Recommend to Commission FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) – Handout Patrick Meyer moved to recommend to Commission FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and Jeff Gilles seconded.

Michael Burner updated on the following:

- The Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) is one of the core MPO planning documents that is updated annually.
- It serves as the budget for the metropolitan transportation planning process and directs the day-to-day work of the MPO. The document describes all transportation planning activities with a corresponding budget Tri-County proposes to undertake during the fiscal year (July1 through June 30).
- Staff has developed the draft 2024 UPWP and following the schedule listed in the memo:
 - Feb. 14: Draft Uniform Budget Template (UBT) and Programmatic Risk Assessment (PRA) submitted to IDOT
 - March 15: Technical Committee recommends UPWP to the Commission for approval
 - April 5: IDOT accepts UPWP, work begins.

Recommend to Commission Section 5310 Funding – Attachment
 Patrick Meyer moved to recommend to Commission Section 5310 Funding and Ty Livingston seconded.

Reema Abi-Akar updated on the following:

- Section 5310 funding is from the FTA, aimed at increasing the mobility options of seniors and people with disabilities.
- Put out a call for projects that ended in February
 - \$355,187 total from 2021, 2022, CRRSAA and ARPA funding
 - Coronavirus Response & Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act
 - American Rescue Plan Act
 - TCRPC received one application- City of East Peoria
 - Phase I Engineering for a pedestrian crossing at IL-116/Main Street and Mariners Way (near Jonah's Seafood House & East Port Marina).
 - Currently no pedestrian signalized crossings or crosswalks here, and this
 is a busy intersection near Route #20 ICC Express CityLink bus stop.
 - Requested \$20,000 federal and a \$5,000 local match (80/20).
- Recommendation
 - Fund this project (HSTP) Urban subcommittee was not opposed
 - 100% federal- COVID funds allow up to 100% federal.
 - Rest of funds
 - Pass along the expiring 2021 funds (\$114,847) to IDOT's Consolidated Vehicle Procurement (CVP) program.
 - Statewide competitive program that distributes accessible vehicles as part of the 5310 programs
 - The remaining funds that will still be available for the next round are \$195,340, plus additional 2023 funds (\$165,242)
 - \$360,582 for next time- maybe in the fall
 - TCRPC has used a combination of these methods in the past

Patrick Meyer asked if 5310 funds are only transit funds and Reema Abi-Akar said yes. Motion carried.

9. Discussion of FY 2024-27 Transportation Improvement Program

Michael Bruner updated on the following:

- Tri-County typically updates the TIP on an annual basis at the beginning of each fiscal year.
- Soon staff will start the process to develop the FY2024-27 TIP
- To aid in the development process, staff will be reaching out to member jurisdictions
 - To get an update on current FY 2023-26 TIP projects, and
 - An idea on additional projects members expected to be funded in FY2024-27

- Discussion of IDOT Statewide Planning & Research (SPR) Program Attachment Michael Bruner updated on the following:
 - IDOT released a call for projects for the SPR 2024 Program on February 24, 2034
 - Applications are due on March 30, 2023
 - SPR funds are used to support planning and research activities.
 - Eligible activities include:
 - Planning studies
 - Data purchase, collection, and/or analysis
 - Research activities
 - Program development activities
 - Performance management activities
 - Coordination/outreach activities
 - A total maximum of \$7 million is available for SFY 24.
 - There is no project cost limitation.
 - Statewide Planning and Research funds are federal funds.
 - A 20% match is required to use these funds.
 - However, a match greater than 20% will be considered positively when prioritizing projects.
 - Projects may request a waiver from providing local match assistance. The waiver
 of the matching requirement will be strongly considered for projects that benefit
 disadvantaged/economically distressed communities.
 - o Today, March 15, 2023- Informational Webinar 10:00-12:00 p.m.
 - Announcement of successful projects is anticipated to be on or about July 1,
 2023

a. Transportation Alternative (TA) Set-Aside Reminder

Michael Bruner updated on the following:

- TCRPC opened a call for projects for the Transportation Alternative (A) Set-Aside on February 15th.
- ii. Approximately \$1,458,565 is available from FYs 2021, 2022, and 2023
- iii. Maximum project award is \$486,188.
- iv. Applications are due Friday, March 31, 2023
- v. Project presentations will occur at the April 19 Technical meeting.
