7. Call for Projects – FY 2023 Special Transportation Planning Studies – Attachment
Michael Bruner explained there is \$123,000 available for FY2023. Applications are due to staff by July 15, 2022. All projects must be completed by December 31, 2023. Need to follow application procedures. Examples of eligible projects are Traffic operation-planning studies; Corridor plans and feasibility studies; Bicycle/pedestrian plans; Transit planning, including paratransit; Air quality planning; Data collection and analysis; Safety and security planning; Storm water planning as is applies to transportation; Multimodal planning; Passenger rail planning; Freight planning, including air; Asset management; and Transportation system management (environmental mitigation)
Eric Miller added he has talked to several communities about Comprehensive Plans.

SUBJECT: Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) Grant Program
DATE: July 20, 2022

Action needed by Commission

- Discuss Safe Streets and Roads for All Grant Program
- Make recommendation on staff's proposed actions

Background

The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) established the new Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) discretionary program with \$5 billion in appropriated funds over the next 5 years. The SS4A program supports Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg's National Roadway Safety Strategy and the Department's goal of zero deaths and serious injuries on our nation's roadways. Eligible activities within the SS4A grant program include developing or updating a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan (CSAP), conducting supplemental planning activities for a CSAP, or implementing projects identified in a CSAP.

Grant Application Details

Within the SS4A Program, there are two types of grants available for eligible entities to apply for: Action Plan Grants and Implementation Grants. To be eligible for Implementation Grants, jurisdictions must have a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan with a project listing. The FY 2022 deadline for applications is September 15, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. EDT (4:00 p.m. CST).

Proposed Actions

Since the Tri-County region does not have a current Comprehensive Safety Action Plan in place, TCRPC is only eligible to apply for the Action Plan Grant. The Tri-County staff proposes to apply for SS4A funding for the entire region to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan, including both the urban and rural areas. The Tri-County staff's proposed approach involves procuring a consultant to facilitate the process and assemble the components of a Safety Action Plan.

It is highly recommended that only one entity in the region applies for the SS4A grant to ensure the Tri-County area has the best chance of receiving this grant. The USDOT seeks to make awards based on safety impact, equity, and additional safety considerations. The SS4A program will provide the necessary funding to create a Safety Action Plan for the entirety of the Tri-County region and provide additional opportunity for future implementation funding after the plan is assembled and approved.
