- (a) Project S-23-14 Safety- Add Turn Lane at IL-166 & Cameron Ln
 - Safety project being added to FY 2023 Program
 - Scheduled for the June letting.
 - Using HSIP funding to add a left turn lane at IL-116 and Cameron Lane.
- (b) Project PEK-24-01 Railroad Grade Crossing Improvement
 - Safety Railroad Grade Crossing Improvements being added to the FY 2024
 Program
 - Two crossings along the Illinois & Midland Railroad at Washington Street and McLean St.
 - Installing new automatic flashing light signals, gates, and new constant warning time circuitry with event recorder and remote monitor and crossing surface.
- (c) Project W-24-02- Railroad Grade Crossing Improvement
 - Safety Railroad Grade Crossing Improvements being added to the FY2024
 Program
 - Two crossings along the Toledo, Peoria and Western Railroad at Zinser Place and Wood St.

- 6. Transportation Alternative Set-Aside Project Presentations
 - a. Village of Germantown Hills
 - Ann Doubet presented the following:
 - Transportation Alternative Project

- Presented the Project Location Map
- Germantown Hills to Metamora Trail
 - Phase I & II Engineering for design of an off-road multi-use trail along IL Route 116. Improvements will be a 10 ft wide hot-mix asphalt path separated from roadway by vegetated buffer.
 - Limits: Woodland Knolls Rd (Germantown Hills) to Douglas (Metamora)
 - o Length: 5.4 miles
 - Project Funding-Phase 1/Phase 2- Engineering--TA Funds is \$240,000, Local Funds- \$60,000 Total funds- \$300,000.
 - 20% local match to be funded by the Village of Germantown Hills, and Village of Metamora.

b. Peoria County

Jeff Gilles presented the following:

- Maxwell Road & Middle Road
 - Presented location Map.
 - Presented existing and proposed cross section.
 - Proposed sidewalk and multi-use path. Will complete connection to over 400 homes.
 - 4 miles of connected sidewalk & path upon completion
 - Project Funding- TA funds \$486,188, Local funds- \$192,761- Total project- \$678,949
- 7. Discussion and Recommend to Commission Transportation Alternative Funding Attachment Jeff Gilles moved to recommend to Commission Transportation Alternative Funding and Rich Brecklin seconded.

Michael Bruner reported on the following:

- Released a call for projects on Feb 15, 2023, for transportation alternative projects.
- The total finding available was \$1,458,565.
- To ensure three projects were funded, staff divided the available funding by three to get the total maximum award of \$486,188.
- Projects were due by March 31, 2023
 - Received two submissions by this date.
 - Staff extended the due date to Tuesday, April 4th due to the severe weather.
- TCRPC received a total funding request of \$726, 188 or 49.8% of the available funding amount.
 - Germantown Hills requested 80% of the total project cost of \$300,000.
 - Peoria County requested 71.6% of the total project cost of \$678,949 due to the total maximum award.

- Staff recommends funding both projects and increasing Peoria County's funding amount to the 80% level.
 - Increase the TA funds by \$56,971 to make the updated funding amount to \$543,159.
 - Makes the total funding amount to \$783,159 of 53.7% of the available funding amount.
 - This would leave \$675,406 in leftover TA funding.

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Call for Projects – FY 2024 Special Transportation Studies

INTRODUCTION

The Commission has programmed approximately \$150,000 of Fiscal Year 2024 Metropolitan Planning Funds for local jurisdictions to undertake special transportation planning projects. Jurisdictions may apply for all or part of the \$150,000 but may not request any additional funding beyond the available amount. Phased projects are eligible, but there is no guarantee that additional funding will be made available in future years.

No match is required, although projects which have local, confirmed match will be given higher consideration. Please provide a resolution or letter committing the local match

Due to the funding source, projects must be completed by **December 31, 2024**, at the latest.

ELIGIBLE PROJECTS

Funds must be used for transportation planning projects that meet the requirements of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act (IIJA), in particular 23 USC 134. These are the same requirements that the Commission uses under its responsibilities as an MPO.

Examples of eligible projects include:

- Traffic operation planning studies,
- Corridor plans and feasibility studies,
- Bicycle/pedestrian plans,
- Transit planning, including paratransit,
- Air quality planning,
- Travel demand modeling or GIS,
- Data collection and analysis,
- Safety and security planning,
- Storm water planning as it applies to transportation,
- Congestion management planning,
- Multimodal planning,
- Passenger rail planning,
- Freight planning, including air,
- Asset management, and
- Transportation system management (environmental mitigation).

This is not a complete list of eligible projects. To determine if your project is eligible, please discuss it with staff. <u>Engineering and construction are **NOT** eligible</u>.

USE OF FUNDS

These projects are for consultant-led projects only. TCRPC will follow its procurement policy to select the consultant to ensure that all federal regulations are followed. Funds may be used for travel expenses by the consultant; however, funds may not be used to purchase capital items (e.g., computers).

PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

Project must be completed by December 31, 2024, and must meet one or more goals of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act and/or Long-Range Transportation Plan 2020-2045. Applicants are encouraged, but not required, to include two or more jurisdictions, and provide local match.

Applications must include the application document and any supporting documents. Applications are due Friday, June 16, 2023, by 3:30 p.m. and submitted via email to <u>funding@tricountyrpc.org</u>.
